# Fact Sheet: PROTECTING WILDLIFE HABITAT



The Belantara Foundation's projects positively impacts forest conservation and restoration efforts, local community development and the protection of endangered species unique to Indonesia.

Belantara works in ten grant areas that cover 10,145,187.85 hectares of land encompassing three national parks (Berbak Sembilang, Bukit Tigapuluh and Kutai), nine wildlife areas, three nature reserves (Pulau Berkeh, Durian Luncuk 2 and Muara Kaman Sedulang), three grand forest parks (Tahura Minas, Tahura Orang Kayo Hitam and Sultan Thaha Syarifudin), and several biosphere reserves. These landscapes are home to 1,000 vertebrate species, of which 213 are endangered.

# Our work at a glance:

## PROTECTION OF ENDANGERED SPECIES:

- We support habitats that are home to endangered species, including the Bornean and Sumatran orangutan, the Sumatran tiger and Sumatran elephant.

## SAFEGUARDS FOR ORANGUTANS:

- We established a primate habitat conservation plan in West Kalimantan, in partnership with IDH and “Kemitraan”. The project includes:
- Analysis of existing data and the formulation of a necessary intervention plan to coordinate primate habitat conservation;
- Development of a map on cross-concessions primate habitat (on Bekantan and Orang Utan) conservation;
- Establishment of a management team;
- Training on Primate Habitat Conservation Management for five companies; and
- Socialization programs for community based conservation programs in 10 sub-villages with 900 participants.

## SAFEGUARDS FOR ORANGUTANS:

- Our work with local villagers includes funding wildlife patrols and conflict mitigation teams. This helps keep animals alive when they wander into villages and onto farms so that they can return to their natural habitats safely.

## HABITAT FIRE PROTECTION:

- Fire prevention keeps forests alive. Belantara supports community-based fire brigades, patrols and early warning systems. We also fund infrastructure projects such as lookout towers, water reservoirs and canal blocking systems that stop fires from spreading.

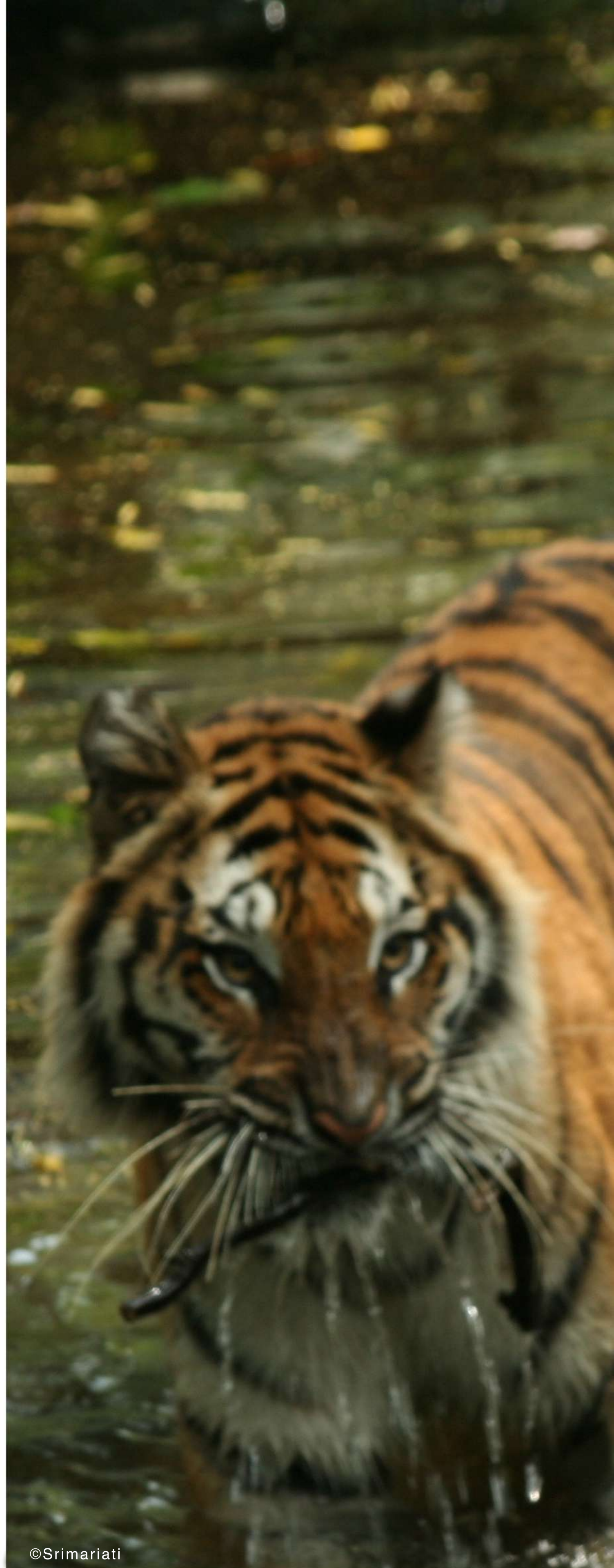
